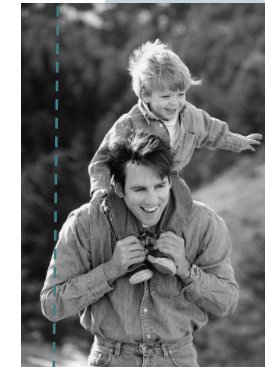

All About Safe Harbor...

History

Since 1998 the staff at Safe Harbor Crisis Nursery has cared for thousands of children in Benton and Franklin Counties, providing crucial support for more than 2000 families. During that time, the incidents of documented child abuse and neglect have declined dramatically on both sides of the river (12% in Benton,

25% in Franklin Counties) due in part to the intervention at the crisis nursery.

Crisis Services

Services are available for critical emergencies 24 hours a day, 365

days a year for up to 72 hours at a time. Supportive child care is provided from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday through Friday for vulnerable, at-risk, and over-stressed families. Call the crisis line: 509-374-4901 to speak to a case manager.



Case Management

The case manager assesses for patterns contributing to family dysfunction, refers to community services, helps strengthen the family's problem-solving proficiency to prevent future crisis, and assists parents to improve life skills. Special programs to evaluate and assess problem behaviors are available for children, birth to age 12.

Licenses and Non-Profit Status

Safe Harbor Crisis Nursery is licensed by the State of Washington as an Emergency Respite Center and a Group Receiving Center. Safe Harbor Crisis Nursery is a 501c3 organization (91-1725914) incorporated in the State of Washington and overseen by a volunteer Board of Directors.



Funding and Fees

There is no charge for emergency or crisis child care. Services at the crisis nursery are supported by contributions of cash and in kind items by individuals, businesses, service organizations, churches and foundations and the volunteers at the Sails Outlet Thrift Store at 408 Fruitland in Kennewick, WA.
